

## Paul's Three Missionary Trips

### Paul's First Trip (with Barnabas) 46-48 A.D. Acts 13:4 to Acts 14:28

Begins in Antioch of Syria at their home church; from Seleucia (a port city near Antioch), they sailed to Cyprus where they preach in Salamis and Paphos; they travel to the mainland, arriving at Perga and John Mark leaves them; Paul and Barnabas continue to Antioch of Pisidia, then to Iconium, Lystra, Derbe, then back through Derbe, Lystra and Iconium to Antioch of Pisidia, departing for Perga, then to Attalia, and from there return by ship to Antioch of Syria.

### Paul's Second Trip (with Silas) 49-52 A.D. Acts 15:40 to Acts 18:23

Overland from their home church in Antioch of Syria, they travel to groups of believers in Syria and Cilicia, and then revisit the churches Paul had founded on his first trip: Derbe, Lystra (taking Timothy with them), then to Phrygia, Galatia, and Troas (where Paul has a vision), then to Macedonia (northern Greece; now Paul is in Europe), Samothrace, Neapolis, Philippi, Amphipolis, Apollonia, Thessalonica, Berea, Athens, Corinth (stays 18 months), Cenchrea, Ephesus, Caesarea, Jerusalem, and finally back to Antioch of Syria.

### Paul's Third Trip 53-57 A.D. Acts 18:23 to Acts 21:15

Once more, Paul leaves Antioch of Syria, making an overland trip first to the churches in Galatia (including Pisidian Antioch, Lystra, Derbe and Phrygia) before returning to Ephesus (stays 2 years 3 months; near the end of this period, he sends Timothy and Erastus to Macedonia to visit Philippi and Thessalonica while he remains in Ephesus), then he goes to Macedonia himself, returns to Corinth, then to Philippi, setting sail from there for Troas, Assos, Mitylene, Chios, Samos, Miletus, Cos, Rhodes, Patara, Tyre, Ptolemais, Caesarea, and finally, he goes to Jerusalem.
